- Know your audience
- Know your purpose
- Learn scripting and storyboarding basics



Basic Principles of audio/video production:

- Use a combination of words and verbal narration
- Present info in bite sized chunks
- Use clear outlines and headings
- Present in a conversational style
- Remove extraneous information
- Use attention grabbers
- Slow it down
- Focus on the big picture
- Set specific goals for your podcast



And specifically for video:

- On screen text should be located near corresponding images
- Synchronize animation and narration

Basic Principles of podcasting:

- Outline/storyboard
- Write a script (ADA compliance)
- Podcasts have a basic form which includes several elements:
 - Show ID—name of the podcast series & presenter information
 - Program ID—what this episode is about
 - Episode—the content of the podcast
 - Credits—very similar to Show ID but may also include a plug for website/contact information
 - Music—Some podcasts include intro and outtake music while others have music throughout
